

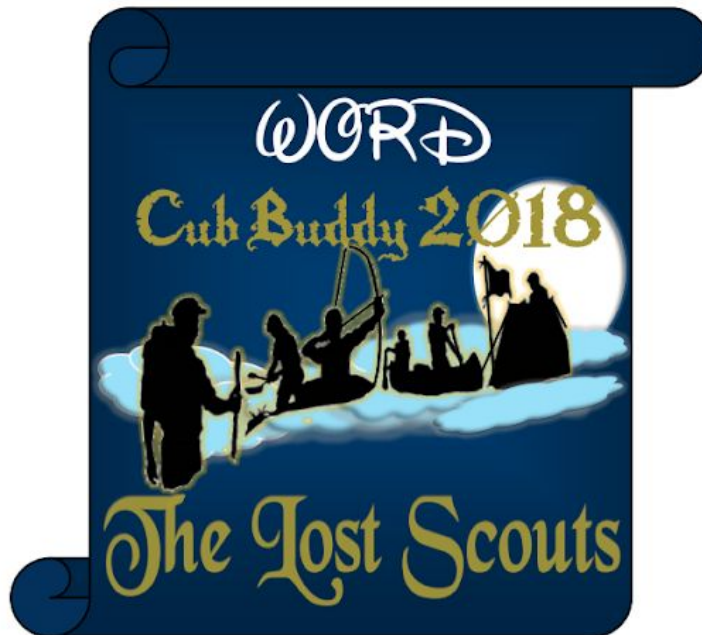

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Directors Letter

Welcome!

Please mark your calendars and join Cub Scouts and their families throughout the White Oak River District for a weekend of fun and adventure at Camp Sam Hatcher November 16-18, 2018! Family and friends are welcome to come out and enjoy the weekend.

The theme this year is Peter Pan and the Lost Scouts. Activities will center around this theme. There will be BB Shooting, Archery, Sling Shots, Jamboree On The Air (not confirmed by publication date), STEM activities, and much more! Please see inside this packet for specifics on the events and other important information. The registration fee is \$15 per person, up to 4 people per family with a max cost of \$60 per family. Children 4 and under are free. Registration closes Wednesday, November 7th. If you have special circumstances and are unable to meet the deadline, please contact the directors. Whether your family camps or comes out for the day, the fees remain the same. The fee is for Saturday participation. Camping is free. Camping is strongly encouraged but is not mandatory.

The gates open and check-in begins Friday afternoon at 4:00 pm. The check-in station hours will be: Friday 4:00 pm - 7:00 pm and Saturday 7:30 am - 8:30 am. If you arrive outside of these hours on Friday night, you will need to park and walk to the Bob Howard Lodge for check-in. If you arrive outside of these hours on Saturday, follow signs for check-in.

These buildings are also your “go to” spots for information and to report injuries or repairs. It is very important for someone from each pack to be present at the leader’s cracker barrel at 8:30 pm on Friday evening and 9:30 pm on Saturday evening at the Bob Howard Lodge. This will be your opportunity to ask questions, raise concerns, and have important information passed to you. Please don’t be late. We hope you have a wonderful weekend filled with lifelong memories!

CAMP SUMMARY

All Cub Scouts as well as their family and friends are welcome to come out and enjoy the weekend. The theme this year is Peter Pan and the Lost Scouts!

Fees: \$15 per person, up to 4 people per family, max of \$60 per family. Children aged 4 and under are free.

Fee Includes: One event patch, contest prizes, and the cost of program supplies. Camping is free and is strongly encouraged but is not mandatory. You are welcome to just come out for the day on Saturday.

Patches: Please note that 500 patches have been ordered. They will be given to pack leaders at the leader cracker barrel meeting on Saturday night. Priority will be given to youth, then registered leaders, then parents until they are gone.

Registration: Registration is a two-step process.

Both registration steps are due Wednesday, November 7, 2018.

Directions to Camp: There isn't a GPS address, but if you plug in "Camp Sam Hatcher" it should come up as Newport, NC 28570. From Onslow County:

- Take NC-24 towards Morehead City
- Turn left onto 9 Mile Rd.
- Continue for 1.4 miles
- Turn right onto Camp Sam Hatcher Rd.

Activities: There will be a movie night, stargazing, BB Shooting, Archery, Sling Shots, Jamboree On The Air, STEM activities, a gateway competition, a cooking contest, and much more!

How to register: To register your family online:

1. Go to <https://ecc.tentaroo.com>
2. Create an account if you do not already have one.
3. Use the “Your Roster” tab to enter the names of everyone attending. If you already have an account, please verify that all of the information is complete and accurate for each person.
 - Please note that children and adults are separate.
 - Please select the corresponding rank for your 5-10 year old children who are not registered in Cub Scouts. Please select the Den Chief rank under Boy Scouts for your 11-17 year old children who are not registered.
4. Once you have entered in everyone’s information and have verified it to be correct, click the “Home” tab.
5. Here you will find “Event Options.” Scroll down until you find “WORD Cub Buddy” then click on it so it is highlighted.
6. Now Select the “Event Registration” tab, then select “+ New”.
7. Select the name of the person you are registering. Verify the participant type and that the event selected is “2018 WORD Cub Buddy, 11/17/2018” then click “Create Registration”.
8. If everything looks correct, click “Save”.
9. This will bring you to a screen that allows you to easily add additional youth and adult registrations. Repeat steps 7 & 8 until everyone is registered. Once everyone over the age of 5 is registered, you can select “Checkout” and complete the payment portion of the registration.

Please remember: BSA policy states that each youth member will be under the supervision of a parent or legal guardian. In special circumstances, a Cub Scout whose parent or legal guardian is not able to attend an overnight camping trip may participate under the supervision of another registered adult member of the BSA who is a parent of a Cub Scout who is also attending. The pack leader and a parent or legal guardian must agree to the arrangement, and all Youth Protection policies apply. At no time may another adult accept responsibility for more than one additional “non-family member” youth. If you have a special circumstance, please make the camp directors aware.

This Campout will follow B.S.A. policies concerning safety and outdoor activities; consult the “Guide to Safe Scouting” for more information.

The basics for ANY Scouting event

Alcohol Prohibited.

Fire Safety All packs are expected to maintain a fire safe campsite at all times. A water bucket is to be placed by each tent and the campfire. NO fire is to be left unattended (without an ADULT watching the fire). Do not dig holes for a fire. All fires must be off of the ground and contained in a fire barrel/fire pit. All fires must be completely out when left (can you put your hand in it?). Do not leave burnt wood, ash or any unused wood at the Camp. Flame sources are prohibited in tents (Coleman lamps, heaters, candles, etc.). Chemical, liquid, gaseous or jellied fuels may only be used by ADULTS and must be secured when not in use, well away from flame sources.

First Aid A first aid kit should be displayed and readily accessible in each pack’s campsite. This kit should be adequately supplied sufficiently for your pack’s size. Any injuries should be reported to the Camp Staff immediately. Each pack is responsible for their BSA medical forms parts A&B.

Knives/Tools Sheath knives are prohibited.

Cub Scout pocketknives are permitted at their pack’s discretion and within their campsite ONLY! Reminder, only Cubs that have earned their Whittling Chip and are under the supervision of an adult may carry a pocketknife. Any knives found outside of the pack’s campsite will be held by the Camp Staff and returned at check out on Sunday. All other cutting tools (hatchets, axes, saws, etc.) are to be used by ADULTS only and securely stored when not in use.

Pets Not allowed, not even to “visit” leave at home.

Smoking/Vaping No smoking or vaping in the presence of Scouts, in or around any buildings/facilities.

Trash Your responsibility and should be taken with you (pack it in, pack it out).

Uniforms Everyone is encouraged to wear the official BSA uniform to all flag ceremonies, campfire programs, and worship services. Please wear your pack t-shirt during station activities. Show your pack pride!

WORD Cub Buddy Specifics

Campsites Campsites will be designated on a first come, first serve basis; please check your map or with pack leaders for specifics. The staff at check-in will also be available to help you.

Vehicle Information

Bicycles Not allowed, please leave at home.

Motorized Campers The only campers permitted are “pop-up” or “truck bed” campers.

Traffic Traffic is **ONE WAY** through the camp.

Parking Parking is only permitted in the designated parking areas. You are strongly encouraged to carpool as parking space is limited. You will be permitted to drive to your camping area during check-in times only. You should drop off your gear then immediately go park in the designated area. Driving space is limited so we want to clear the path as quickly as possible. If you have a wagon, it is encouraged that you bring it to make this process easier. ATV's, three-wheelers, and motorcycles are not permitted beyond the main parking area at any time. Special consideration for handicapped individuals should be arranged with the camp ranger/caretaker. No vehicles are permitted on the wilderness trails.

Electricity Electricity is available at each pavilion but not at each campsite. Please plan accordingly. Generator use is prohibited.

Water There are water stations available. You will need to bring containers to store water in. Please conserve water as much as possible.

Bathrooms There are permanent bathrooms at camp that will be available for use. We will also have 10 port-a-potty units placed throughout the camp. Please talk with your Scouts about proper bathroom behavior and cleaning up after themselves. We will be asking for volunteers to help clean up the restrooms during the following time: Saturday (morning, afternoon, and evening) and Sunday morning. Remember that a **Scout is CLEAN and HELPFUL!**

Bathhouse The bathhouse will be available during camp for females and on an as-needed basis. They will not be open for general use. It is the responsibility of all who use it to keep them clean. Remember a

SCOUT IS CLEAN.

General Rules and Regulations

Leaders, please discuss these rules with your pack prior to attending camp.

1. The following items are prohibited: sheath knives, fireworks, firearms, illegal drugs, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products (including vapes), and bicycles. The only people using electronic devices should be adults. Cub Scouts should be engaged in the program or exploring the great outdoors. Alcoholic beverages and/or illegal drugs (or those under the influence of the same) are **ABSOLUTELY NOT ALLOWED** on the camp property at any time. Violators will be asked to leave and local authorities notified. All smoking materials must be properly extinguished and disposed of in Butt Kits or field-stripped and properly disposed of in trash receptacles.
2. Scouts are not to roam unsupervised through the campsites at anytime.
3. Cutting of live trees is not permitted. Use only fallen dead wood for fires. The cutting of standing trees or shrubs without the consent of the Ranger is prohibited.
4. All fires must be built off of the ground. Unit fire fighting equipment must be easily accessible.
5. Pack leaders are responsible for their members at all times.
6. All vehicles must be parked in the designated parking area. Staff vehicles are to be parked in the staff parking area unless being used to conduct staff duties.
7. Scouts will remain in their pack campsite area between taps and reveille unless being escorted by an adult. (10pm -7am are quiet hours)
8. Buddy System will apply for the entire weekend.
9. Defacing, destroying, or “trashing” of property belonging to the BSA, Sam Hatcher, or other people is strictly forbidden.
10. Scouts are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that will bring pride to their pack and the BSA.
11. Rough housing and horseplay are strictly forbidden.
12. Scouts will keep the campground clean. Throw wrappers and garbage into the designated trash receptacles.
13. No pets are allowed at camp.
14. Closed-toe shoes must be worn about the camp at all times.
15. The ditching of tents or the digging of holes for any reason is not permitted.
16. Do not injure, collect, feed, or otherwise disturb the wildlife, including their nesting areas. Remember, this camp is their home. We are the visitors.
17. Fire Ants can be harmful or fatal and are an ever-present hazard in Coastal North Carolina. Please be aware of nests, particularly when

standing or when children are about and in contact with the ground.

Outdoor Cooking Contest Guide

The purpose of this event is to encourage outdoor cooking at pack campouts. Cub Scouts learn by observing the adults in their world. By watching you cook outdoors, they will learn the basics of outdoor cooking. You are encouraged to allow the Scouts to help in age-appropriate ways. When Cub Scouts become Boy Scouts, the youth are responsible for cooking the meals for their patrols. Lead by example.

Rules

All cooking must be done at your pack campsite. You are encouraged to not precook, chop, slice, or dice anything prior to the campout. Chopping, slicing, and dicing are perfect responsibilities for your older, more responsible Cub Scouts (most likely Webelos.)

Please limit entries to 3 per pack.

Cooking can be done by any means as long as it is done at camp. Examples include: dutch oven, direct heat, grilling, boiling, frying, and roasting. Each chef must provide their own equipment (i.e. Dutch oven, table, utensils, cutting board, gloves, etc.).

Please use safe food handling procedures. Start with clean equipment and use clean cooking practices. No finger-licking or 5-second rules (if you drop it, it goes in the trash!)

Cub Scouts can be tasked with cleaning non-sharp equipment and utensils.

The finished dish must be presented for judging at the Bob Howard Lodge no later than 6:30pm.....no exceptions! Bring your dish prepared in 3 sample sized containers (plastic cups or plates work great for this) and completed recipe page. Remember to label the bottom of your entry samples with your name and pack number.

Judging will be done by the Camp Staff. The judges will score your dish for taste, level of difficulty, and whether it is properly cooked.
